## BBQ MIXED CASE

No matter the weather, or how charred those sausages get, kick off National BBQ Week in style. Chosen for their bold fruit to complement those moreish smoky flavours from your grill, these wines are a mix of vibrant whites, summery rosés and succulent reds. Whether you are searing fresh seafood, glazing your teriyaki salmon or adding nothing to your meat except an open flame, this selection will tick all the boxes.

## TASTING NOTES

### **Pazo la Maza Albariño, Adegas Galegas 2018 – DO Rías Baixas, Spain**

Lively, saline and refreshing, this 100% Albariño pays homage to its emblematic homeland: the Rías Baixas – a series of natural, unspoilt estuaries lining southern Galicia's coast.

Adegas Galegas winery is nestled within a breath-taking landscape - an amphitheatre of vines surrounded by colourful hydrangea and scented pine forests, overlooking the River Miño, next to the Portuguese border. Founded in 1995 by Pepe Rodriguez, the winery has championed local grape varieties since the beginning and Pepe is now known internationally as the father of modern Albariño.

On top of Galician cliffs overhanging the Atlantic Ocean, whipped by constant breezes, stand the Pazo la Maza vineyards. In the XVIII century, this ancestral land witnessed the rise of the noble family La Maza, who owned a handful of manor houses in the area, known locally as "Pazos". The Pazo that bore the family name was their favourite and legend says an Albariño vineyard flourished in the majestic courtyard. Four centuries later, our star grape continues to patiently grow and gently bloom, sheltered under traditional pergolas made of granite to mitigate against the capricious weather conditions.

## Chardonnay, Terroir Series, Bodega Ruca Malen 2018 – Mendoza, Argentina

Grown in the foothills of the Andes in the highly prized Uco Valley, this subtle yet complex Chardonnay is Burgundian in style.

Bodega Ruca Malen is a boutique winery located in the foothills of the majestic Andes. Founded in 1998 by two spirited French pioneers, their philosophy has not changed: to create terroir-driven wines of great finesse. Their accomplished head winemaker, Noelia Torres, is on a constant quest for excellence and brings her passionate personality and feminine grace to the wines.

Here, high in the Andes mountains, Ruca Malen has a collection of unique Chardonnay plots, scattered throughout the prestigious Uco Valley. Combining intense luminous sunshine with cooler nights, their vineyards yield grapes of excellent varietal purity and a sense of freshness.

## Intipalka Syrah Rosé, Viñas Queirolo 2018 – Ica Valley, Peru

This structured and mineral rosé, from grapes grown in the Andean "Valley of the Sun", stays true to its varietal, whilst adding a sense of the exotic.

In 1880, the Queirolo family arrived in the far west of Peru, having emigrated from Italy. This entrepreneurial family, faced with the dramatic desert scenery this land had to offer, embarked on an extraordinary journey developing a flourishing business producing Pisco, the signature spirit of Peru, and pioneering winemaking in this remote region.

At the turn of the century, they planted a few hectares of French clone grape varieties in the heart of the Ica Valley. This unique terroir, located at 500m altitude, impresses with its gigantic, steep dunes of sandy loam and is blessed by constant, intense sunlight. Moderated by Pacific Ocean breezes, it gives bright and mineral wines. Meaning "Valley of the Sun" in the ancient language of the Incas, this was the birth of Intipalka.

Like the varied and innovative Peruvian cuisine, this wine finds balance in its contrasts. The vivid pink juice has flavours of succulent pomegranate, savoury cherry and a lightly spiced floral note. Taut and refreshing, with just a little bit of grip and a moreish saline finish.

## Salterio Mencía, Adegas Galegas 2017 – DO Bierzo, Spain

A subtle, delicately perfumed and versatile red made from 70 year old bush vine Mencía planted on high altitude terraces. A tribute to Bierzo's finest delicacies: music and wine.

Bierzo is a remote, historic wine appellation found in Spain's north-western corner. This tiny region is a lush, green enclave within the warm, dusty, ochre Castilla y Leon. This oasis of natural beauty benefits from a unique microclimate, perfect for viticulture – a place that enshrines its most precious gem: the Mencía grape.

While indigenous to this part off the Iberian Peninsula and grown across a handful of appellations, Mencía's true home is considered by many to be Bierzo. Here, it is planted on slate terraces over a spectacular range of microclimates and delivers a range of styles, from light and fragrant to rich and complex. The name Salterio - which refers to a local, traditional medieval instrument - celebrates the region's troubadour era and poetry, with an indigenous wine style as delicate and fragrant as its past is lyrical.

Salterio is a soft, fragrant and fruit-forward red, packed with freshly picked cherries and blackberries, hints of violet and refined by a distinctive mineral note. Smooth and refreshing – an ode to summer.

## Chamuyo Malbec 2018 – Mendoza, Argentina

A classic example of Argentina's signature grape variety, made from mature Malbec vines planted high in the renowned Luján de Cuyo region at the heart of the Mendoza wine country.

Mendoza Vineyards is a dynamic winery founded in 2003 by a passionate, talented team led by head winemaker Richard Bonvin - a name with a destiny! Set in dramatic scenery overlooked by year-round snow-capped Andes mountains, the winery owns a variety of spectacular sites covered with rare, un-grafted and low-yielding vines – a haven stranded within the wide desert landscape. The team has been mastering Malbec to produce balanced wines with impressive varietal purity that reflect the land they came from.

While originally from France, Malbec has made Argentina its second home. Generally bold and elegant it embodies the Argentinian spirit, as does Chamuyo. Meaning 'to whisper of passion and desire', the word is derived from some colourful 19th century Buenos Aires slang called 'Lunfardo' and is often referred to as the language of tango.

## Cabernet Sauvignon, Domaine de Saissac 2017 – Languedoc, France

A long-time favourite at Corney & Barrow, this old vine Cabernet Sauvignon grown in sunny Languedoc, right by the Canal du Midi, shows what modern winemaking in southern France can achieve.

Picture yourself on a barge, floating up the picturesque Canal du Midi. In the heart of southern France, it is 6pm in summer and it feels as though time has stopped. Your nose is charmed by the scent of wild flowers and your ears magnetised by the lapping of the water. Your eyes remain captivated by the curved alleys of centenarian plane trees, bordering both riverbanks, capturing a halo of golden light underneath their branches. You reach the bank to discover Domaine de Saissac – an old stone house standing in a peaceful 20 hectares of gnarled, old bush vines.

Sandwiched between the canal and the nearby Montagne Noire, the estate is part of the ancient Minervois region, known to many as one of the cradles of French winemaking. It is in this Mediterranean territory, flooded by year-round sunshine and refreshed by sea breezes, that low-yielding Cabernet Sauvignon vines produce a generous nectar with distinctive freshness.
