### **Cecilia Beretta Prosecco, DOC Treviso NV – Veneto**

*Fragrant, bright and fruity prosecco. A versatile wine for every occasion – al fresco evenings, celebrations, or alongside a wide variety of dishes.*

The Cecilia Beretta estate was founded in the 1980s by the Pasqua family – legends in the Italian wine world. This estate aims to shine the spotlight on the traditional local styles and indigenous grape varieties of the Veneto region.

The principal grape of prosecco wines, ‘Glera’, has been grown in this area for hundreds of years. The grape’s gentle aromatics and invigorating acidity make it ideal for producing sparkling wines with an easy-going manner – plenty of fruit, soft, creamy bubbles and uplifting freshness.

Fresh and fragrant, with delicate aromas of citrus and sweet almonds. The crisp palate pops with green apple and ripe peach, beside the creamy, foaming bubbles and sherbet finish.

## Pazo la Maza Albariño, Adegas Galegas 2018 – DO Rías Baixas

Lively, aromatic and refreshing, this 100% Albariño pays homage to its homeland: the Rías Baixas – a series of unspoilt estuaries outlining Galicia's southern coastline.

The Adegas Galegas winery is nestled within a breath-taking landscape - an amphitheatre of vines surrounded by colourful hydrangea and scented pine forests, overlooking the River Miño, next to the Portuguese border. Founded in 1995 by Pepe Rodriguez, the winery has championed local grape varieties since the beginning and Pepe is now known internationally as the father of modern Albariño.

On top of Galician cliffs overhanging the Atlantic Ocean, whipped by constant breezes, stand the Pazo la Maza vineyards. In the XVIII century, this land witnessed the rise of the noble family La Maza, who owned a handful of manor houses in the area, known locally as "Pazos". The Pazo that bore the family name was their favourite and legend says an Albariño vineyard flourished in the majestic courtyard. Four centuries later, our star grape continues to grow patiently and bloom gently, sheltered under traditional pergolas made of granite to mitigate against the capricious weather conditions.

## The Southerly Chardonnay 2018 – South Australia

A New World Chardonnay with Old World restraint and poise, packed with ripe pear, grapefruit, peach and an infusion of kaffir lime

Taking its name from the southerly breeze that sweeps in from the nearby Ocean most afternoons and cools down the vines across South Australia, The Southerly Chardonnay offers exceptional value for money. It has been blended by boutique winery The Lane, with grapes sourced from a selection of small grower vineyards in Padthaway, a region that has earned quite a reputation for its pristine and pure fruit Chardonnays. Grapes for The Southerly have been selected to balance delicate flavours and elegance with some richer, riper fruit characteristics.

Brilliant pale lemon with green hues, the nose shows lifted citrus and white peach. The palate is packed with ripe pear, grapefruit and brioche notes with focused minerality, fine texture and Asian flavours of kaffir lime and lemongrass.

## Pinot Grigio 'Montevento' Rosé 2019 – Veneto

The copper-tinged skins of the Pinot Grigio grape provide the gentlest blush of pink to this crisp, summery rosé from northern Italy.

It is nearly a century since the first generation of Pasqua brothers came north to Verona to start a business trading wines from their homeland in Puglia. Throughout the twentieth century, the brothers and subsequent generations of the family acquired fantastic vineyard sites in the Veneto region and developed an international business. Today the winery is in the hands of the third generation of the Pasqua family, who continue to invest and innovate, in both the vineyards and the winery, on a constant quest for excellence.

Fresh and fruit-forward. Floral notes, with flavours of pear and apricot. Great as an aperitif or as an accompaniment to pasta and risotto dishes, as well as fish and white meat.

## Quinta de Chocapalha Tinto 2015 - Lisbon

From the sunny hills of Alenquer, northeast of Lisbon, an easy-drinking, warming red.

Paulo and Alice Tavares da Silva bought this historic Quinta in the Eighties, forty-five hectares in Alenquer, north of Lisbon, which enjoys a maritime climate. The farm's production was initially sold to cooperatives in the main but when their daughter Sandra, once a top model, proved to be a prodigiously talented winemaker, the family decided to take their own wines to the market and in 2000, Chocapalha was born. Sandra believes in balancing traditionalism with modernity, producing wines with a lightness of touch and refreshing aromatics.

40% Touriga Nacional, 25% Touriga Franca, 15% Tinta Roriz, 10% Castelão and 10% Alicante Bouchet

Deep ruby violet, this has lovely intensity on the nose, a heady blend of black cherry and blackberry, refreshed by spice and floral notes. The palate, elegant and well-balanced offers soft tannins and a refreshing acidity through to a poised finish.

## Morgon 'Corcelette', Domaine Lathuilière-Gravallon 2018 – Beaujolais

So much more than your average Beaujolais, this supple and perfumed wine, from the *Cru* vineyards of Morgon, showcases the careful craft of a small estate.

In the far south of Burgundy, Beaujolais has its own distinct personality and style. The Gamay grape is grown on granite and schist soils, producing wines with a fruity profile unique to the region. Morgon is one of Beaujolais's highly regarded *Cru* villages, producing wines with great depth of flavour and ageing potential. Domaine Lathuilière-Gravallon is a small estate in the heart of Beaujolais that has been in Cathy Lathuilière's family for five generations. As the current custodians, Cathy and her husband Cédric work their vineyards as closely as possible to organic principles, combining traditional methods with more modern thinking. The vineyards are planted on steep slopes, so machinery is impractical and everything must be done by hand. In the hamlet of Corcelette, they carefully select the grapes from their fifty years old vines to ensure only the best bunches make it into the winery. Typical for Beaujolais, the grapes undergo carbonic maceration, whereby whole bunches are placed intact into the fermentation vat, rather than crushed first. Unusually, the fermentation then takes place within the grape, giving a wine with vibrant fruit flavours and low tannins.

A generously perfumed nose, core of juicy blackberry fruit and lively hints of orange peel playing around the edge of the palate. It rounds off with fine, talc-like tannins and a satisfying, lingering umami note.

- Environmentally friendly techniques in the vineyard, with careful consideration of nature's needs.
- Beautiful expression of Gamay, with a delicate perfume and real finesse.
